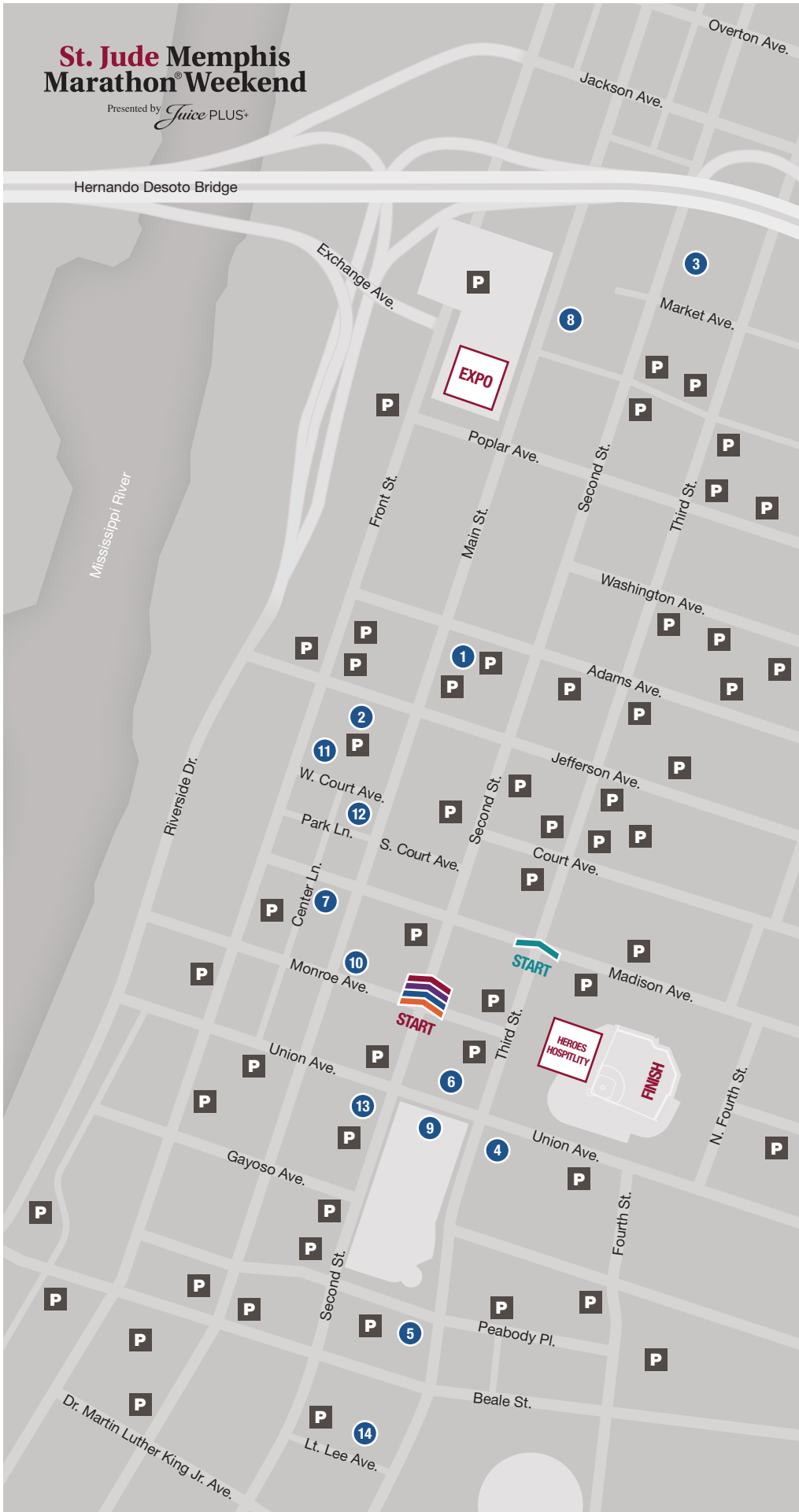

Marathon Landmarks

- Court Square Park:** Of all the 4 original municipal parks laid out by the city planners in 1819, Court Square is the only one left in its original form. Ironically the land was set aside to build a court house, but no courthouse was ever built on Court Square. It was however, the site of Memphis' first schoolhouse.
- FedEx Forum and Rock 'n Soul Museum:** Opened in September 2004, this state-of-the-art arena is home to the NBA's Memphis Grizzlies and University of Memphis Tigers basketball teams. It also serves as a concert venue for top tier music acts such as Katy Perry, Usher, Foo Fighters, Elton John, Justin Timberlake, and more.
- Gibson Guitar Factory and Lounge:** Offers tours of the factory where some of the world's most famous guitars are made. The lounge offers world-class entertainment.
- Lorraine Motel and National Civil Rights Museum:** Marks the site of the 1968 assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., this museum traces the history of the Civil Rights Movement in the United States from the 17th century to the present.
- Tom Lee Park and the Mississippi Riverfront:** Overlooking the Mississippi River, the park is named after Tom Lee, an African-American riverworker, who saved the lives of 32 passengers of the sinking steamboat M.E. Norman in 1925. Tom Lee Park is a popular location for walkers, joggers, roller bladers and cyclists, and hosts events throughout the year, including the Beale Street Music Festival that kicks off Memphis in May.
- The Orpheum:** Originally the Grand Opera House, it was built in 1890 and rebuilt after a 1923 fire. Over 100 years, the Orpheum has brought in large-scale Broadway shows, like Phantom of the Opera, Cats, and Les Miserables, while continuing to offer performances from great entertainers like Jerry Seinfeld, Dorothy Hamill, Tony Bennett, the and many more.
- Elvis Statue on MLGW Plaza:** A tribute to the man who earned the title "King of Rock 'n Roll" and made Memphis his home: Elvis Presley.
- Beale Street and W.C. Handy Park:** Voted the most iconic street in America by USA Today, world famous Beale Street serves up Memphis BBO and blues music every day of the week. Live bands can be heard playing at W.C. Handy Park, named after the "Father of the Blues."
- Historic Cotton Row:** By the 20th century Memphis was the largest inland cotton market in the world. All this cotton led to the development of Front Street - the first City Street above the riverfront. Front Street became the heart of the cotton trade and the center of the Memphis economy for more than a hundred years, and the street earned it's nickname "Cotton Row".
- University of Memphis Law School:** The University of Memphis Cecil C. Humphreys School of Law is an American Bar Association accredited law school and is the only law school in Memphis, Tennessee.
- The Cannon Center:** World-class performing arts center opened in January 2003. The 2,100 seat multi-purpose facility is home to the Memphis Symphony Orchestra.
- Bass Pro Shops/The Pyramid:** The multi-purpose arena is 32-stories tall, making it the third largest pyramid in the world.
- St. Jude Children's Research Hospital:** St. Jude Children's Research Hospital is leading the way the world understands, treats and defeats childhood cancer and other life-threatening diseases.
- Humes High School:** Look to the north as you cross Manassas St. on North Parkway to see where Elvis Presley attended school (grades 7-12). In his final year, he won the senior talent contest, earning the event's only encore applause.
- Vollentine-Evergreen Community:** A historic and character-filled neighborhood in Midtown Memphis.
- Evergreen Historic District:** One of the oldest neighborhoods in the city and the first Historic Conservation District, this area hosts a unique mix of aged architecture with fresh entertainment and restaurants.
- Sears Crosstown Concourse Development:** The Crosstown Concourse is an art deco high-rise building in Memphis, Tennessee. Originally built as a Sears mail-order processing warehouse and retail store, the building is currently being renovated into a mixed-use vertical urban village.
- Memphis Zoo:** Located in Midtown Memphis, the Memphis Zoo is home to more than 3,500 animals representing over 500 different species. Created in April 1906, the zoo has been a major tenant of Overton Park for more than 100 years.
- Target House:** A home-away-from-home for families whose children are receiving medical treatment at St. Jude. Target House provides fully-furnished apartments free of charge as well as common areas that foster interaction with other families.
- Overton Square Entertainment District:** In the 70's, Overton Square was home to 11 restaurants, 27 shops and employed 800 Memphis locals. Today, Overton Square is home to thriving businesses anchored by four live-performance theaters and a multi-screen movie theater. Loeb Properties is cultivating this local landmark into a new kind of arts and entertainment district that is a destination for locals and visitors alike.
- University of Tennessee Medical Center:** One of the largest academic health science centers in the United States.
- Sun Studio:** Legendary recording studio of Elvis, Jerry Lee Lewis, Carl Perkins, Johnny Cash and other luminaries.
- Rhodes College:** Established in 1925, this liberal arts college has been cited as one of America's most beautiful campuses and one of the best colleges in the country by the U.S. News and World Report.
- Overton Park:** This area encompasses the world class Memphis Zoo, Brooks Museum of Art, the Links at Overton Park golf course, and The Shell amphitheater.
- Christian Brothers University:** Founded in 1871, this private institution is ranked one of the top colleges in the South by the U.S. News and World Report.
- The Fairgrounds:** This Municipal property is home to the Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium (site of the AutoZone Liberty Bowl football game) and hundreds of other events each year.
- Cooper Young Community:** The "heart of Midtown", the revitalization of this area in the past decade has led to an eclectic collection of homes, shops and restaurants.
- Central Gardens District:** Developed primarily between 1900 and 1929, this was Memphis' most prestigious neighborhood for wealthy businessmen, politicians, and physicians. Though the area declined after WWII, revitalization began in the late 1960s and continues today.
- Victorian Village:** A collection of homes built in the 1800s. Tours are offered that highlight the furniture and décor of the period.
- AutoZone Park:** Finish Line. Home of the Memphis Redbirds and the Museum of Minor League Baseball. This state-of-the-art facility features the largest video board in Minor League Baseball and a picnic pavilion.
